Rausch's early work is an intense assault upon American values. In the first person singular, he demands an accounting for his nation's history, exposing venality in high places and the forces that hold it together. How can a country that has made the writer's life a living hell be his new home? Combining a lyricism to match the grandeur of Whitman's and the free-associative explorations of Frost, Rausch examines American culture, art and politics, celebrating idiosyncratic characters like the women who danced with the first President Bush and lamenting the life of a poet trapped inside a society that ignores the beauty of existence. He is a recipient of the National Book Award for his first book of poems, *The Lunatic Express* (1971) and the Lenore Marshall Poetry Prize (1982) for his book of prose and verse, *Passing Through Gates* (1995). Rausch has published five other books of poetry, the most recent being *Doppelgänger* (1991), published in German by Wagenbach Verlag. Rausch has taught at the universities of Michigan, Princeton, and Iowa, and was a visiting professor at the University of Munich in 2001. He and his wife are the co-directors of the literary journal *Jacket2*, and they live in New York City. At the age of 18, Thomas Rausch, the son of German immigrants, decided he was a poet. At 25, when he decided he wanted to be a writer, he was already a published poet. In his thirties he joined the American Academy of Arts and Letters and has published several collections of poetry, one of which won the National Book Award.
